





DEFINE SHARED GOALS

- Listen first
- Translate concerns → goals
- Revisit regularly

DEFINE SHARED GOALS

STAKEHOLDER MAPPING

- Identify all voices
- Power dynamics
- Plan inclusive engagement

TOOLKIT GUIDANCE:

- · Categorize stakeholders by type, interest, and influence.
- Analyze power dynamics who holds influence? Who needs extra support to participate fully?
- Tailor engagement: youth workshops, separate elder forums, digital tools for remote voices.
- Update regularly stakeholder maps are living documents.

- Participatory Mapping Platforms
- Stakeholder Mapping Templates: Visual templates
 (e.g., Miro's Climate Adaptation Stakeholder Map) help identify,
 analyze, and prioritize key stakeholders, clarifying roles,

- Roundtable and Workshop Facilitation Guides


ACTION CHECKLIST:

- Identify and adapt digital, technological, and analogue tools for community engagement.
- Provide training on selected platforms (e.g., mapping, surveys, dashboards).
- Ensure all tools are accessible to diverse participants.
- Regularly review tool effectiveness and update as needed.

INDICATORS & METRICS

- Build metrics that account for the value of human connections and potential of new opportunities regarding "shared goals"
- Build community-driven metrics
- Build "experimental" metrics of the "progress over perfection" approach –where errors and mistakes and unexpected outcomes are essential

ACTION CHECKLIST:

- Co-design indicators with community members to reflect local priorities.
- Establish baseline data for all key indicators.
- Schedule regular monitoring and participatory evaluation sessions.
- Use both quantitative and qualitative data for a holistic assessment.
- Share results transparently and use findings to inform decision-making.

OVERCOMING CHALLENGES

CHALLENGE

SOLUTION EXAMPLE

Funding Instability	From Le Plus Petit Cirque du Monde (France): - Develop "cultural action" grant streams - Implement cross-sectoral membership models (sliding scale)
Knowledge Fragmentation	From Institute for X (Denmark): - "Do First, Permission Later" pilot approach - Mobile library of traditional building techniques (remove barriers to information)
Need for direct participation and input from local and indigenous communities	From Borneo Laboratory (Malaysia): - Trained Indigenous Dayak volunteers to map deforestation using drones and batik storytelling
Change as opportunity	From Culturans (Mexico): - Spot new opportunities. Change is uncomfortable, but clinging on to old habits is riskier than ever. Staying flexible and open

OVERCOMING CHALLENGES

ASSESSING APPROPRIATENESS ACROSS CONTEXTS

- Cultural & Social Fit → Align with values, adapt with sensitivity
- Environmental Suitability → Assess climate, soil, resources
- Ethical & Knowledge Sovereignty → Rights, consent, reciprocity

OVERCOMING CHALLENGES

STRATEGIES FOR SCALING UP

- Document & share learnings (toolkits, case studies, stories)
- Build networks & communities of practice
- Leverage policy & funding pathways
- Invest in local capacity (skills, leadership, resources)





SUSTAINABILITY PLANNING

- Diversify funding
- Cultural sustainability
- Adaptive leadership

TOOLKIT GUIDANCE:

- Blend multiple revenue streams: grants, earned income, in-kind support, community bonds or crowdfunding.
- Confront funding inequities advocate for direct access for Global South communities.
- Ensure cultural sustainability: transfer knowledge across generations, protect biocultural heritage, integrate arts and storytelling.
- Empower local governance and leadership.

SUSTAINABILITY PLANNING

ACTION CHECKLIST:

Diversify funding sources (grants, earned income, in-kind, community finance).

- Invest in intergenerational knowledge transfer and cultural heritage protection.
- Build organisational capacity in management and adaptive leadership.
- Regularly review and update your sustainability plan with community input.
